Recent FMC Developments

Re-registration for 2018

The annual re-registration process is underway: re-registration e-mails were sent on 8th January. If you are already registered with the FMC and have not received an e-mail inviting you to re-register for 2018, please check the e-mail account you used to register with the FMC, including your junk mail folder. Renewal of accreditation

The FMC's rolling programme of re-accreditation has started. Mediators who transferred in to FMCA on 1.1.15 and have a surname beginning A-D should have submitted their first application for re-accreditation; if this applies to you and you have not submitted your application, please e-mail fmsb@familymediationcouncil.org.uk so we can advise you of the next steps to be taken.

Other mediators who transferred in to FMCA on 1.1.15 should submit their applications for re-accreditation in accordance with the timetable as follows:

Mediators with surnames beginning	Apply for re-accreditation between
E-L	March – May 2018
M – R	June – August 2018
S-Z	September – November 2018

Mediators who became accredited in or after 2015 are required apply for reaccreditation every three years from their accreditation date.

Priorities for 2018 & 19 and review of the Standards Framework

The board of the FMC and the members of the FMSB recently met to discuss plans for 2018 and 2019. This enabled the FMC to finalise its priorities. The FMC and FMSB are now working together to agree how to implement these plans, and in particular how to conduct the review of the Standards Framework to ensure views of mediators are considered.

Child Inclusive Mediation

The FMSB is finalising its plan to implement the recommendations of the FMC working group on Child Inclusive Mediation. It will shortly be issuing guidance to mediators about the steps that they will need to take over the coming years, to make sure they comply with the new standards.

Family Mediation Week

This week (commencing 22nd January) is Family Mediation Week. This aims to raise awareness of mediation and its benefits for separating families. Organised by the FMA, its <u>website</u> includes a number of short pieces from across the family mediation community which explain the benefits of family mediation which may be of interest to separating couples. FMC Survey

The <u>headline</u> from the FMC's survey in autumn 2017 showed that family mediation works, but low levels of awareness mean families are missing out. In addition, the survey provided the FMC with lots of additional information which the FMC and FMSB will use to help inform their work throughout 2018. Developments from elsewhere

Changes to MIAMs exemptions

MIAMs exemptions have changed and corresponding amendments to court Forms A, A1, B, C100 and FM1 have been made. The driver for these changes was concern that the exemptions for domestic violence were unduly restrictive. Full details can be found on the FMC website.
