Recent FMC Developments

PPC Code and Guidance

The FMC has published its <u>PPC Code and Guidance</u>. The FMC would like to thank Adrienne Cox and all the members of the joint FMC/FMSB for their time and effort spent developing these documents, as well as everybody who responded to last autumn's consultation regarding the draft documents. The working group considered every consultation response and found the comments very valuable; a number of amendments to the drafts were made as a result of the consultation.

PPCs are asked to give early attention to these documents to ensure that they make arrangements to comply with the requirements of the Code.

The FMSB is considering whether consequential amendments to the Code of Practice for mediators are necessary, as well as considering whether to produce a template consultancy agreement for PPCs and mediators to use.

2019 Registration

Registered mediators have all been sent registration forms for 2019. Standards Review

The FMC will shortly be circulating a questionnaire for completion both by registered family mediators and people who have considered/are considering becoming family mediators. This survey will help us identify the particular pain points in the current process. We encourage mediators to complete the survey when this is circulated and to share with others who also have experience of the accreditation process,

particularly those people who have started the process but not completed it. The survey should take about 20 minutes to complete, and the more responses we can gather, the more informed those conducting the standards review will be.

Reducing Family Conflict Consultation Response

In December, the Family Mediation Council submitted its <u>response</u> to the Ministry of Justice's Consultation, <u>Reducing Family Conflict</u>, which sets out the government's proposals for 'no-fault divorce'.
