Recent FMC Developments

Standards Review

As you may already be aware, the Standards Review Accreditation Working Group met on 3 April to discuss the responses to the recent Accreditation survey. This resulted in the group agreeing that issues would be considered on two tracks: practical and pragmatic improvements to the existing system, that should be introduced as soon as possible; and the strategic exploration of new models to make the whole process more fit for purpose in the longer term. Since that meeting, the FMSB has been continuing work on issues on each of these tracks. In relation to the former, it expects to make recommendations for improvement to the current system to the FMC (to be considered at its June Board meeting), and is putting in place a number of additional resources to try to help mediators working towards accreditation. More details will follow in the coming months.

Child Only to Full AIM

A small number of mediators who transferred in to FMCA on 1 January 2015 did so on a 'Child Only' basis, having achieved accreditation under the previous system which allowed this. The FMSB has now agreed the requirements and procedure for those mediators who have 'Child Only' accreditation to become accredited for 'All Issues'. Child Inclusive Mediation (CIM)

Mediators are reminded of the requirement to attend either a CIM Update Day (for mediators previously trained in Direct Consultation with Children (DCC)) or a CIM Awareness and Understanding Day (for mediators previously trained in DCC).

Mediators who are working towards accreditation who submit their portfolio after 31 August 2019 will need to have attended a CIM Awareness and Understanding Day before they submit their portfolios.

Mediators who are accredited but not previously trained in DCC will need to attend a CIM Awareness and understanding Day by 1 January 2020 or the first post-2018 reaccreditation date, whichever is the later.

Mediators who are accredited and have been previously trained in DCC will need to attend a CIM Update Day by 1January 2020 or the first post-2018 re-accreditation date, whichever is the later. CIM Logos are available for mediators once this course is complete.

Volunteers needed for FMSB Panel

The FMSB is looking for two mediators, one of whom is a PPC, to join its PPC Panel. This new panel's role includes advising the FMSB on the implementation of the PPC Code of Practice and maintaining the PPC Register. Early work will include drafting a template PPC agreement that will be made available for PPCs and mediators to use. It is expected that the panel will meet four times a year. Developments from Elsewhere

New Minister

A recent cabinet reshuffle has resulted in the minister who was responsible for family justice, Lucy Frazer MP, moving in to a new role. The minister now responsible for Family Justice is Paul Maynard MP. The FMC is looking forward to meeting the new minister and encouraging him to do more to promote the use of family mediation.

CAP Review

The President of the Family Division, Sir Andrew McFarlane, recently formed a working group to make recommendations to improve the Child Arrangements Programme. It is expected that a formal consultation outlining these recommendations will be published shortly.

Pensions Advisory Group

The FJC's Pension Advisory Group is producing a guide to pensions on divorce for the benefit of judges, legal and financial practitioners and the divorcing public. Since its inception, PAG has deliberated and invited feedback from practitioners on the issues to be addressed and, as part of its work, has produced two draft reports for consultation at http://www.nuffieldfoundation.org/pensions-divorce-interdisciplinary-working-group. The group has now analysed the feedback, discussed revisions to the report, and is in the process of preparing the final drafts of a combined, professional guide with detailed appendices. The target date for publication of the final guide is 30 June 2019, with a much-simplified guide for non-specialists and the divorcing public being published on-line by the end of September 2019.
