Recent FMC Developments

Standards Review – Changes to the Standards Framework and resources to help mediators

The FMC's review of the accreditation process is continuing. The Chair of the FMSB has written to all mediators to provide an update on the review – this update can be read <u>here</u>.

One result of the review is that the FMC and FMSB have <u>agreed immediate</u> <u>amendments</u> to the portfolio requirements, to provide mediators with more opportunity to demonstrate the competencies required to meet the scheme's standards. The <u>Standards Framework</u> has been amended as a result.

The FMC and FMSB are also putting in place more practical support for mediators working towards accreditation. A <u>list of PPCs</u> available to take on consultees and guide them through the accreditation process has been introduced and can be found on the FMC website, with more documents aimed at providing support and guidance due to be added to the website in the coming months.

Renewal of Accreditation

Accredited mediators are reminded of the need to renew their accreditation every three years. The FMSB's Accreditation Panel has made an <u>example</u> of a well-completed application available for mediators. It is recommended that mediators keep records of their CPD, including a note of benefit to their clients, and all PPC contact on a rolling basis, to ensure accuracy of applications and to make the process less time consuming for them.

Mediator Member of FMSB

The FMC is seeking to appoint a family mediator member to sit on the FMSB. Members will be at the forefront of the implementation and development of the new standards and self-regulatory framework of the FMC. Please see here for more details. Child Inclusive Mediation (CIM) (This information was printed in the last newsletter but contained an error, so has been corrected and is included again for clarity)

Mediators are reminded of the requirement to attend either a CIM Update Day (for mediators previously trained in Direct Consultation with Children (DCC)) or a CIM Awareness and Understanding Day (for mediators not previously trained in DCC).

Mediators who are working towards accreditation who submit their portfolios after 31 August 2019 will need to have attended a CIM Awareness and Understanding Day before they submit their portfolios.

Mediators who are accredited but not previously trained in DCC will need to attend a CIM Awareness and understanding Day by 1 January 2020 or the first post-2018 reaccreditation date, whichever is the later.

Mediators who are accredited and have been previously trained in DCC will need to attend a CIM Update Day by 1January 2020 or the first post-2018 re-accreditation date, whichever is the later. CIM Logos are available for mediators once this course is complete.
