Recent FMC Developments

Family Mediation Survey 2019

A very big "thank you" to everybody who completed the FMC's Family Mediation Survey in the autumn. Key highlights from the survey are:

- That family mediation works it results in whole or partial agreement in 73% of cases.
- 73% of cases proceed to mediation, if a mediator sees both parties for an assessment meeting.
- Mediators charge £140 (including any VAT) per person per hour for mediation, on average.
- The average total cost for both participants to attend a MIAM, a successful mediation, and any relevant outcome documentation is £1641.
- The amount of Child Inclusive Mediation which is taking place has more than doubled to 26% of relevant cases, since 2017.

Family Mediation Week – 20-24 January 2020

The FMC is pleased to be supporting Family Mediation Week, which aims to raise awareness of mediation and its benefits for separating families.

Organised by FMA, but open to all family mediators to participate, the theme of the week for 2020 is 'Conversations'. FMC directors Ewan Malcolm and Jane Robey are recording interviews about the results of the FMC's survey, which shows that mediation works to help family members settle their disputes.

Recent FMC Submissions

The FMC has submitted a <u>response</u> to the interim report published by Professor Stephen Mayson at UCL as part of his <u>Review of Legal Services Regulation</u>. The independent review is intended in part to explore the longer-term and related issues raised by the 2016 Competition and Markets Authority's (CMA) Legal Services Market Study and its recommendations.

The FMC has also had the opportunity to comment on draft Best Practice Guidance on domestic abuse which is being developed by the Family Justice Council. The FMC was concerned that the impression given in the draft guidance was that mediation is to be avoided where there has been domestic abuse. While the Family Mediation Council agrees that mediation may not be appropriate in certain cases involving domestic abuse, it considers that the abused person should be able to mediate if it safe and they choose to do so. Our response pointed out that mediation has advantages that the court cannot replicate, including giving participants a voice, and the chance to make decisions for themselves. We therefore suggested some changes to the draft to reflect this, and look forward to seeing the revised guidance once the FJC has had an opportunity to consider consultees' responses.

Rethinking Support for Separating Families

In November, our Executive Officer, Helen Anthony, attended an event jointly hosted by the Nuffield Foundation and CAFCASS 'Rethinking support for separating families: A scoping event to improve the response to parental disputes about child arrangements'. The purpose of the day was to explore what a Supporting Separating Families Alliance (SSFA) might look like. SSFAs were suggested by the Private Law Working Group as part of the Child Arrangements Programme (CAP) Review.

Lots of interesting ideas were explored – these <u>illustrated notes</u> are an excellent summary of discussions. However, the FMC remains concerned about who will fund and co-ordinate a central national service to lead any such project.
